Rescue and Immediate Care Course

Information Pack

Course Description

This course introduces participants to the rescue and provision of first aid in Australian wildlife. Topics covered in this course include:

- Work, Health & Safety
- Species Identification
- Common Rescue Scenarios
- Safe Handling Techniques
- First Aid
- Physical Examination
- Immediate Care

Entry Requirements

There are no educational prerequisites for this course; however due to WIRES License requirements, participants must be at least 18 years old to enrol.

To volunteer under the WIRES licence, you must not be a current member of another licensed wildlife organisation.

A reasonable level of fitness is beneficial to undertake the Practical Workshop component as activities will involve carrying out simulated rescue scenarios and may include heavy lifting.

Due to the nature of wildlife rehabilitation, emotional resilience is advantageous.

Course Access Requirements

Participants are required to have access to the internet in order to complete the online theory component and enrol into a workshop. If a participant does not have their own internet access, many public libraries provide this service. Delivery Method and Course Outcomes

This course has two consecutive components.

1. Online Theory
2. Workshop Component



Online Theory

The estimated duration of the online theory of the course is eight hours; however some participants may take more or less time to complete this section.

Workshop Component

The workshop component of the RICC can be completed **either** online or at a face-to-face workshop. Both of these options take one full day or six to eight hours in total.

- **Online Workshop:** allows you to complete the workshop component while remaining contactless.
- **Face-to-Face Workshop:** WIRES face-to-face workshops are run at various locations throughout NSW. Please note, these workshops are held by region, not suburb, and some travel may be required. Please also be aware that there are limited places available in each workshop and that scheduled workshops may be impacted by the ongoing COVID-19 situation. Scheduled workshops are listed at:

Enrolment Duration

Participants are required to complete these components within 12 months of enrolment. Extensions may be granted upon request for extenuating circumstances.



Fee Information

- WIRES will not provide refunds once a participant has commenced any part of the course.
- WIRES may need to cancel, postpone or reschedule workshops when necessary due to low enrolment numbers or extraordinary circumstances. If this occurs, the participant will be offered an alternate date and location within their enrolment period or a full refund.
- Participant that request to cancel their enrolment prior to commencing the course may be eligible for a partial refund. Refund requests are assessed on an individual basis and will incur an administration fee of 20% of the course fees paid (\$25).
